PURIFIED WATER REPLENISHMENT

The planned Purified Water Replenishment project is part of EMWD's Groundwater Reliability Plus program to improve the quality and quantity of water in local groundwater basins. Purified Water Replenishment includes recharging a blend of advanced treated water (purified water) and recycled water into the ponds at the Mountain Avenue West Groundwater Replenishment Facility. Planned facilities include an advanced treatment facility adjacent to the San Jacinto Valley Regional Water Reclamation Facility, brine evaporation ponds, groundwater wells, replenishment ponds, and new conveyance pipelines for water delivery. When working together, these facilities all play an important role in providing our region with a safe and reliable water supply future and improving groundwater quality.





EMWD's San Jacinto Valley Regional Water Reclamation Facility, located on Sanderson Avenue, turns wastewater into a high-quality recycled water supply.



1. The Journey Begins... 2. Advanced Treatment —



EMWD's planned Purified Water Replenishment Treatment Facility, adjacent to the San Jacinto Valley Regional Water Reclamation Facility, will use microfiltration and reverse osmosis to purify recycled water.

EMICROFILT RATION water



Recycled water is pumped through tubes filled with tiny membranes made up of hollow fibers and perforated with holes 1/300th the width of a human hair. Solids and bacteria are caught in the fibers and removed.



REVERSE OSMOSIS



High-pressure pumps force water through a semi-permeable membrane that transmits water but stops dissolved salts and other constituents.

3. Through the Pipeline — 4. Replenishment Ponds



Pipelines will take the purified water to the eastern portion of San Jacinto to EMWD's Mountain Avenue West Groundwater Replenishment Facility.



Once at the Mountain Avenue West Groundwater Replenishment Facility, the water may be blended with recycled water and imported State Water Project water, when available, and percolates into our local groundwater basin.

The water is further purified through the natural soil aquifer treatment process while underground.

6. Groundwater Wells




7. Final Purification

The well water receives a last cleaning at the future Hewitt & Evans Groundwater Treatment Facility before entering the distribution system and piped to homes and businesses.



After the water is further cleaned through the natural soil aguifer treatment process over several years, it will be pumped out through several new groundwater wells throughout the San Jacinto Valley.


How do I qualify for EMWD's water use efficiency rebates and services?
