



Perris North Groundwater Program

Perris North Groundwater Treatment Facility

In the summer of 2021, Eastern Municipal Water District (EMWD) will began work on an important project as part of the Perris North Groundwater Program in the City of Moreno Valley.

The Perris North Groundwater Treatment Facility project will consist of two groundwater wells, a blending station, and a centralized treatment facility that will treat the water from several wells in central and southern Moreno Valley.

The water will travel through new pipelines that will be located primarily along Perris Boulevard and Kitching Street.

Construction on this facility is anticipated to be completed by 2024. The majority of the work on this site will be done during daytime hours. Some intermittent 24-hour work will be required during construction and residents will be notified in advance of this work.

The Perris North Groundwater Treatment Facility is an important part of EMWD's Groundwater Reliability Plus initiative, which will increase our reliance on local groundwater and help our region become more sustainable, especially during periods of statewide water shortages.

Quick Facts: Perris North Groundwater Program

- In 2020, EMWD received an agency-record grant from the State Water Resources Control Board to fund approximately half of the estimated project cost for the Perris North Groundwater Program. The grant is funded through the voter-approved Proposition 1 Water Bond of 2014.
- The Program will include six groundwater wells, 16 groundwater monitoring well locations, a centralized treatment facility, and conveyance pipelines.
- Work on this Program began in late 2020, with well drilling starting in January 2021 at the first two groundwater wells located in northern Moreno Valley along Ironwood Avenue.
- Well construction has been completed; a total project completion date is to be determined.
- The Program will improve groundwater quality in the North Perris Groundwater Basin, located in the Moreno Valley area, and also increase water supply in the region.



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
