Board of Directors Summary for **April 5, 2000**

Work Session

The Directors recognized two employees for 10 years of service: **Connie Gomez**, Systems Administrator, Information Systems, and **Edward Westendorf**, Water Reclamation Plant Operator III, Temecula Valley Regional Water Reclamation Facility.

...approved and authorized a \$56,540 engineering services agreement with Environmental Data Solutions Group for a sewer system hydrogen sulfide management study. The particular systems to be investigated are the Cawston, Winchester and Sun City lift stations and force main systems. Funding will come from the General District Replacement and System Betterment Reserve Fund.

...approved and authorized an additional \$209,500 for installing a water pipeline in the Murrieta I-15 bridge for providing service to the Murrieta County Water District. The project will be financed from Service Area No. 43 (Lake Skinner) Restricted Water System Expansion Fund, with eventual reimbursement by the Murrieta County Water District.

...approved an additional \$479,110 appropriation for the relocation of the Mariposa Sewage Lift Station from the service road of the Mariposa Storm Drain Channel to a site within the Moreno Valley Regional Water Reclamation Facility. Financing will come from the Replacement and System Betterment Construction Reserve from Service Area No. 32.

...approved an additional \$212,221.25 for an amendment to the task order for C.P. Construction Company to cover actual costs of the Cajalco Road Water Relocation Project. Funding will come from Service Area 41 (Mills Treatment) Replacement and System Betterment Construction Reserve.

...authorized presentation of U.S. savings bonds to the top three essay winners of the MWD student essay contest on how the Diamond Valley Lake reservoir project will benefit them and future generations. The three Hemet students are Kristin Duffin, Brendan Steele, and Christina Wimer.

The Board heard from Director **Clayton A. Record, Jr.** on Senate Bill 1594, authored by Senator David Kelley, which proposes to reduce the number of MWD Directors from 51 appointed positions to 13 elected members. EMWD has gone on record opposing the legislation.
