Eastern Municipal Water District now accepting reservations for free, high-efficiency toilets

Perris, CA (January 17, 2007)— Back by popular demand, Eastern Municipal Water District is accepting reservations for another high-efficiency toilet distribution and recycling event for residential customers. If you currently have a toilet installed in your home (pre-1992) that uses 3.5 or more gallons per flush, don't miss this opportunity to save water and money.

High-efficiency toilets use 1.28 gallons/flush or less—20,000 fewer gallons annually than non-conserving toilets which can use 3.5 to 7 gallons/flush.

On March 31, EMWD's residential customers, with reservation numbers, may pick up their free, high-efficiency toilets at a designated location, then return and recycle their old ones on Saturday, April 14.

To make reservations, call (800) 485-2321 prior to the event. Eligible customers will be given a reservation number and the distribution and recycling event locations.

This offer is limited to three toilets per household while supplies last.

EMWD is the freshwater, wastewater service and recycled water provider to a 555-square mile area from Moreno Valley southward along the I-215 corridor to Temecula and eastward to Hemet and San Jacinto. Approximately 630,000 people live and work in this area. In addition to its own water customers, EMWD supplements water to eight local water agencies and municipalities that have their own water departments.
