

ONE FINE SPRING AFTERNOON...


Hey Turtle!

Oh! I guess it has been kind of dry for a while.




Even though it's April there is not as much rain as there used to be.

AND THUS, THE ADVENTURE BEGINS...




I'm on the phone with the water provider, honey!

They speak to this "water provider" about their water.




Yeah, we need to get the water turned on. I'll call the water provider about that.

It seems like this water provider is our best bet.




But, we still don't know how they get all this water, or who they are.

Not to mention where they keep it.




Well, now that we're in town, we should ask a human about that.

But, they'll freak out!






Wait, I have an idea!


You just have to go and...


Ooh, a river?

That's us, let's board!






A reservoir!

Cool!





The water in there is called "developed supply." I bet they need it because the water in California is shrinking.

Once we're there, let's go right to the river.


