



The little village was not entirely at peace. Evil Queen Ivana was always in her tower plotting ways to waste water.




Yawn!

Every the morning, Lily and her friends would meet in the woods to play and think of ways to save water.


***"Evil Queen Ivana,

" My loyal henchman, go find Lily's seven drops and take them away. Make sure she can never find them!"




"Yes, Queen, right away!"

The next day Lily could not find her little friends anywhere.





"Guys...?"

"Noooo! My evil plan is ruined!"




FREEDOM!!

Vocabulary Words:

California Friendly Plant: A strong and hearty plant that does well in California's climate and needs little water.

Climate: The normal weather conditions for a particular area.

Conserve: To use something (water) carefully in order to prevent loss or waste.

Deeds: An act or an action.

Drought: A long period of time during which there is very little or no rain.

Evil: Something that is bad.

Freedom: The power to do what you want to do: the ability to move or act freely.

Henchman: A trusted follower or supporter who performs unpleasant or bad tasks for a powerful person.

Hero: A person who is admired for great or brave acts or fine qualities.

Plenty: The state of having enough of something that makes life good and easy.

Plot: To plan secretly to do something that is usually harmful.

Practice: To do something regularly or constantly as an ordinary part of life.



Preserve: To keep something in its original state or in good condition.

Recirculated: To move or pass through a system and back to starting point.

Ruin: To damage something so badly that it is no longer useful.

Turf-grass: The upper layer of ground that is made up of grass and plant roots.

Village: A small town in the country.

Waste: an action or use that results in the unnecessary loss of something valuable.

In 2008, the award-winning Write Off program was developed by Eastern Municipal Water District Education Specialist Malea Ortloff, in an effort to encourage a greater understanding, in both elementary and middle school students, of our most precious resource—water. Malea uses a cross-age approach, which allows older students to write stories focusing on water-related issues geared toward younger (elementary) students.

Malea designs curriculum, around many of the winning stories, that is grade-level appropriate and also keeps the water message in the classroom for a longer period of time. This year the topic focused on the ongoing California drought and students were tasked with conveying a message about the impact it has on our lives.

In 2015, more than 300 students participated in the writing contest and two winning entries were selected. *Lily And The Seven Drops* is fact-based fiction narrative about water conservation and drought. The story encourages readers to understand the meaning of drought and the importance of water conservation during a drought, and always. The story will be developed into a flannel board presentation and presented, distributed and available to students within the Eastern Municipal and Rancho California Water District service areas.


